

## Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities involving Animals – England) regulations 2018 – Fees 2022 -2023

The First application fee Part A applies to **all new and existing licence holder applications** this fee must accompany the application.

The fee payable on grant Part B will be invoiced to the applicant, plus vet fees where applicable. This is dependent on the duration of licence issued and must be paid prior to release/issue of the licence.

The renewal fee applies to renewal applications under the new regulations, so will not apply until 2019 at the earliest.
