## National Productivity Investment (NPI) Fund Allocation

A £378k boost for road improvements in Rutland has been welcomed by the county council.

The Government has awarded a share of its £185 million National Productivity Investment Fund to Rutland County Council, to reduce congestion at key locations, improve roads and support job-boosting developments and housing.
