You will work with Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists, to help deliver an agreed Reablement plan, to help Service Users identify and achieve their goals relating to a range of social care tasks such as washing and dressing, showering, meal preparation and helping people engage in community activities.

You will also assist individuals with their medication, catheter management, mobility and transfers. You must have the ability to communicate effectively, both verbally and in writing, to provide written observations of the person's progress.

An NVQ 2 in Care is desirable but not essential as training can be provided to work towards this qualification.
