

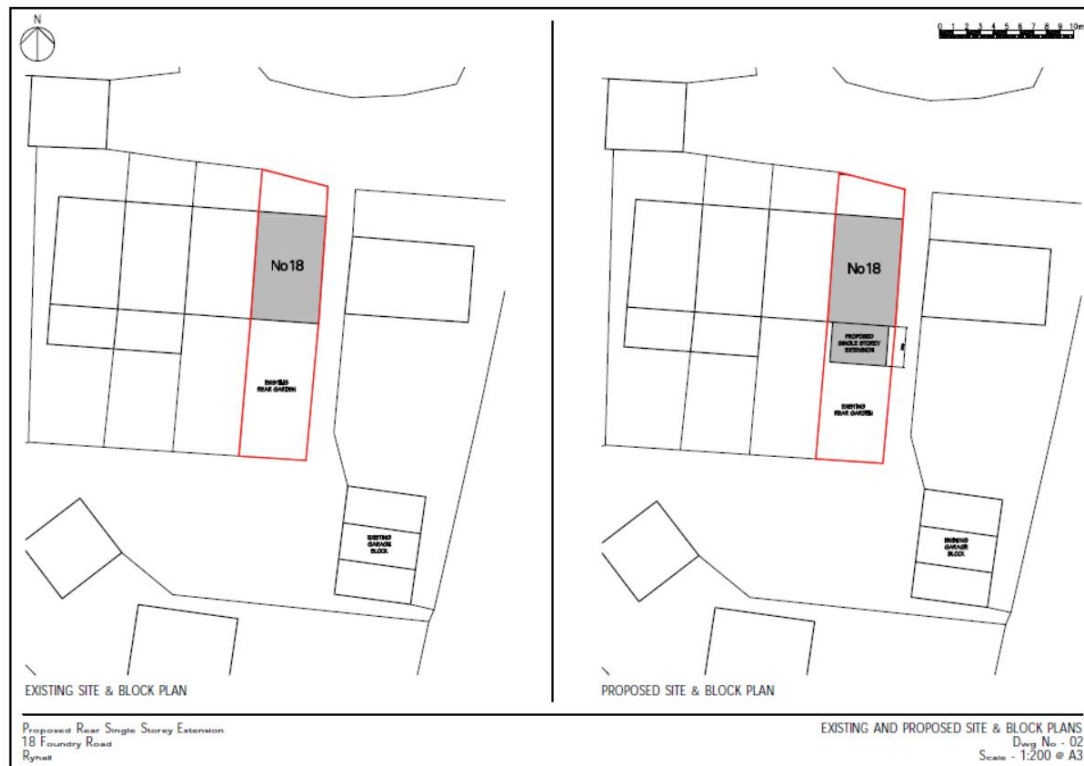
## Block Plan

A Block Plan aka Site Plan is used for the planning officer to assess the impact of the proposed development on the property and the existing elements on the site, it is also used to reflect the impact the proposed works will have on adjacent neighbours and the adjoining area.

This should be drawn at an identified metric scale (typically 1:200 or 1:500) and should show the proposed development in relation to the site boundaries and other existing buildings on the site. The plan should also show the direction of north.
