Notice that an Enhanced Partnership Plan and Enhanced Partnership Scheme have been made

Rutland's Enhanced Partnership Plan and Enhanced Partnership Scheme have been through a 28 day public consultation period, which concluded on 23rd March 2022.

The report outlines how public feedback has been taken into consideration, but also outlines that no changes have been made to the EP Plan and EP Scheme as a result of the public consultation.

Competition test – declaration

At the point of making the EP Plan and EP Scheme their impact on competition was reassessed.
