Rutland County Council have restricted on street free parking over the last twenty years to ridiculous levels. Double yellow lines have sprung up all around the town centre and its environs. This forces people into car parks as fee payers. Our small towns of Oakham and Uppingham are failing in attracting independent retail because people simply don't want to pay for car parking. Why don't you take a hard look at the highway line markings around the town and remove some restrictions. Double yellows to single yellows (for the evening economy) or single yellows to free on street parking. Save money in signage and yellow lining. Smarten up our town from signage. It is over-signed - you need to review (and possibly save money). Provide free car parks for the first two hours everywhere in Oakham and Uppingham. Enforce resident parking in the town. By providing free on street parking places people won't use the enforced resident spots. We treat our town as a city in its restrictions. We have grown residentially with the new Barleythorpe and ring road developments but the town centre is still failing... The council tax income must have improved sufficiently to be able to provide free car parking in the town to entice shoppers back to the high street? Provide a cheap bus service to Leicester, Nottingham and Peterborough with good timetables 7am to 10pm. Providing local employment and good core services for workers. The train service is excellent- but very cost prohibitive. A zebra crossing point at Gaol Street to Lloyds Bank would be good. It is hard to cross the road due to high street traffic. If we want our town to thrive we need to love it and care for it. A bit of town centre footpath weed (summer) and leaf debris cleaning in Autumn Winter would also help. It is becoming dirty and scruffy. The old school path in the park is impassable due to weeds between the path and building/walls. A bit of community pride work wouldn't go amiss!
